INTRODUCTION

Elections in the Republic of Benin take place within the framework of a multi-party democracy and a presidential system. Both the President and the National Assembly are directly elected by voters, with elections organized by the Autonomous National Electoral Commission (CENA). The presidential elections held on April 11, 2021 led to the victory of incumbent President Patrice Talon of the Independent Party. Ahead of the election, the political atmosphere was characterized with protests, distrust, suppression of the media and threats against political opponents.

Following the outcome of the 2019 legislative elections held in the country, the stakes of this presidential election are more salient and higher because of the common sentiment that the outcome is rigged in favor of the incumbent president, who was declared to have won over 86% of the votes.¹

In order to further deepen understanding about the Benin elections and the context in which it took place, the Electoral Hub, an organ of the Initiative for Research, Innovation and Advocacy in Development (IRIAD), has been tracking the trends and happenings in Benin ahead of the election. This database gives an overview of the various events that took place in the country in the three months preceding the election. It is hoped that the information provided in this database will facilitate further research and discussions among CSOs, election practitioners, and the general public in order to conceptualise solutions to improve the integrity and credibility of our electoral process in Nigeria.
